Q1: Why do you require 5 years warranty for LOT 3?

A1: Please, provide 2 price options in this case: Option 1 – price for 3 years warranty and Option 2 – price for 5 years warranty.

Q2: The same as Q1 - for LOT 4.

A2: For desktops and notebooks (LOTs 1 and 2) UNDP requests a minimum warranty period of 3 years. It is logical to request same warranty period for printers (LOT 4), as this period is the usual lifetime of a project. We would like to have the same warranty period for all types of equipment in order to avoid technical problems at mid-point.

Q3: Do you also need MS Office software?

A3: No, it is not included in the specifications.

Q4: What would happen if a company does not provide some of the required documentation (ex. company profile, balance sheets, etc.)?

A4: The Schedule of Requirements lists the documents that offerors should present and asks offerors to describe delivery procedures, warranty conditions, and trade customs applied to warranty service, maintenance of stocks of equipment and spare parts etc. These documents and information provided will help UNDP assess whether an offeror s qualified and meets our minimum requirements. Failure to present some information may serve as basis to disqualify the bid.

Q5: What is the minimum quantity of different types of equipment ordered by UNDP Moldova? A5: Statistics show that in 2008 UNDP Moldova procured equipment (desktops, laptops, monitors, printers) worth of 415,000 USD. However, please, note that this is just an indicative figure and UNDP Moldova does not guarantee that similar volumes would be ordered during the next years. A6: UNDP does not discriminate any producer or brand of equipment. UNDP's only requirement is that offered equipment is FCC compliant and compatible with the Microsoft Hardware Compatibility List.
